


If you missed the announcements in the newsletters and want more information before signing up, please contact me.

March Speaker

Trent Pridemore, TVFF Life Member

Trent Robert Pridemore resides in Grass Valley and Carnelian Bay, California. His zoological background stimulated an earlier interest in fly fishing that led him to involvement in angling conservation. He was Project Chairman and Biological Consultant for the Little Truckee River Trout Restoration Task Force in the mid "70's" that ultimately led to what has become a major and unique trout resource in the Wild Trout Program. In 2006 he orchestrated Regulation Proposal Changes that resulted in Wild Trout status for the Truckee River and its tributaries between Trout Creek and the Nevada State Line. He was also involved in the implementation of winter angling on the Truckee and Yuba River systems and is a recipient of the "Black Hand" conservation award.

Program: Flyfishing The Upper Water Column For Large and Smallmouth Bass

My 50 minute PowerPoint presentation evolved from two feature articles on flyrod bass fishing that I wrote for California Fly Fisher several years ago. The program focuses on the upper water column where bass are reachable with a fly rod. I discuss the biology that brings bass into shallow areas, bass food items and the types of water that produce better inshore and topwater action, effective fly patterns and tactics. I also talk about the revolution in flyrod bass fishing tackle that includes specialty rods, lines and innovative new flies. California waters are covered as well as the spectacular Northern largemouth fishery at Oregon's Davis lake and Florida strain fish at Mexico's El Salto reservoir.

A bonus section at the end looks briefly at "Bugging For Browns in Chilean Patagonia", where Brown trout behave like bass and take Fat Alberts as well as dragonfly patterns and bass bugs.

Conservation Corner

Drought Emergency Fishing Regulations and Closures

Roger Perry

In response to at least one suggestion that I report on drought driven fishing regulations and closures, I assumed a quick visit to the DFW website www.dfg.ca.gov would yield a list of the affected water systems and I would include them here. My search wasn't that simple. Your mileage may vary.

Upon navigating to the above web site, I immediately saw a button labeled "Angling Closures". I'm in, I thought. I clicked the button and the page it took me to looked promising. It spoke of the current drought conditions in our state and the need for emergency action with regard to closures. It also referred to a map which could be "clicked" for more information on specific streams. I saw no map.

Perhaps it was just "down" during my visit. This is not intended as a criticism of the dfw or its website, just the difficulty in obtaining current information on this topic. There were phone numbers to call for information on closures which yielded the type of information I was hoping for. There was also an admonishment that "Some rivers and streams will open and close as flows change and other rivers will be closed for the season."

Because of the dynamic nature of this problem, I have chosen not to try to include a list of the closures but to advise anglers to check at the above mentioned website for current information on the specific waters you hope to fish.
